God cannot be taken lightly; we must meet God on God's terms.


- To be human is to be confronted by God's demand—his claim on our lives and our worship.
- We must approach God in humility, reverence, openness, and awe.
- God cannot be flattered, manipulated, or controlled.

- Life is not a continual test, but neither is it an endless frolic.
- Life is serious business and what we do matters to God.
- Awareness of judgement tempers our behavior but need not wreck our happiness.

- We can find joy in life only by faithfulness to the wisdom God has built into his creation.
- Foolish & profligate behavior never ends well.
- To forget God when we are young invites regrets, bitterness, and emptiness when we are old.

- Solomon's exploration of life and wisdom brings him back to where he started (see Prov. 1:7; 9:10).
- Sometimes the most enduring wisdom is the simple yet profound things we think we have outgrown.

- Solomon's wrecking ball of meaninglessness has smashed to dust all that we put our vain hopes in; what remains is the truth of our utter dependence on God.
